All are encouraged to attend PTO meetings. You may be wondering what PTO (Parent Teacher Organization) is all about? It is a group that strives to enhance the educational experience of all students (and have fun while doing it!) We do this in a variety of ways:

Student Drop Off / Pickup

To improve student and parent safety while dropping off students in the morning we want to share our suggested drop off system. This system creates a loop through the neighborhood. When dropping off your child please turn on E. Commercial Street instead of California Street. You will then drive down two blocks, turn left onto Jackson Street and then left again on to California Street. That will allow you to arrive at school with your passenger door facing the school. We have a lane marked off with cones so that you can pull up in front of school, stop for a short amount of time and get your students off to school. You are always welcome to start off your day with us! We enjoy seeing parents on campus in the morning. If you plan to stay at school for a while, please try to park against the fence if there is room.

The Postal Service also has requirements regarding delivery and collection of mail. We have been asked to keep the mailbox area clear of vehicles. Help keep our mail delivered efficiently by parking in areas away from the boxes. Thank you.
